#NBFF 2021

kNOwBOX dance Film Festival (NBFF) is an international dance film festival with multi-country live screening events followed by an international spring tour. The festival presents dance films that explore an innovative approach to collaboration, mixed media, and interdisciplinary filmmaking.

THE FESTIVAL

The kNOwBOX dance Film Festival was founded in 2019. Prior to the independent kNOwBOX dance Film Festival, the co-creators curated and served as creative collaborators for founding the Dallas Dance Film Festival in partnership with the Dance Council of North Texas in 2018. The Dallas Dance Film Festival and NB team recognized the need for more digital dance exposure and support for emerging and professional dance filmmakers in Dallas, Texas, USA.

The next year, in 2019, kNOwBOX dance decided to strike out on their own and develop their own dance film festival in order to serve a larger community. In creating their own independent film festival, NB focused on how to further develop best practices that center the filmmaker, facilitate opportunities for interested artists to be involved in the festival, and prioritize conversations and sustainable connections between artists and the art-curious community.

NBFF screens national and international dance-related films that challenge the possibilities of what dance can look like in video form. These films are curated by the kNOwBOX dance team and an alternating international jury of award-winning filmmakers. kNOwBOX dance finds it important to acknowledge concepts of access, inclusion, power, and race in order to interrup some of the same structures of oppression; thus, writing a more equitable future.





NBFF PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

This year NB presents NBFF 2021: Dancing Outside the Box. The films take the kNOwBOX dance tagline, "say NO to the BOX," to unexpected places and offer stunning landscapes, emotional narratives, and thought-evoking reflections that invite the viewers (familiar and new to dance and film) to think outside of the box.

Outside of the Box: Program A

10 Films / 67 minutes

Program A features ten dance films that explore an innovative approach to framing striking visual landscapes, history and tradition, and queerness among other current issues.

Outside of the Box: Program B

8 Films / 71 minutes

Program B features eight dance films that defy rules and possibilities and push the envelope for dance-related films in a bold evocative way by offering representations of current social and political happenings, diverse communities, and abstract art.

The Texas Feature Film highlights a film created by Texas-based arts and service organization DNAWORKS.






